**Perusal of minutes from January meeting.**: Read. Fixed attendance, two attendees missing. No approval necessary.

**MAPS Superintendent Report:** Bill very ill, Deb is representing the district for him. We are at nine snow days. Some districts downstate are between 12 and 19 days. Law now says 6 are forgiven and up to 3 can be requested waived...but only after lengthy discussion of making up days...justification, why not making them up...4 pages of justification. Required 180 days and 1098 hours. Unfair to have so many less hours of instruction when teachers merit pay is based on students' performance. Thursday, June 6 is last day, Friday is good make up day. Snow days are considered act of God after April 1.

Planetarium is seriously looking for funding opportunities; their projector is completely unusable/broken.

H.S. Parking lot trying to change structure of access in front—big summer project. Will be rough summer for access.

Summer school started summer feeding program last summer, kids come to lunch for free, 2 feeding sites, parents can eat for reduced cost. Tried it last summer for 6 weeks, had attendance and started to grow. Chris Collins, in charge of food service, tries to do farm to table foods and whole muscle meats.

Projected 3260 FTE for MAPS district next year. Currently 3189 FTE. Decline attributed to a big senior class, 261 graduating, 227 replacing them. This is a

consideration, budget will be less. Kindergarten sign up needs to be well publicized, JK numbers also count.

**MAPS School Board Report:** Last night met at alternative H.S., for amazing tour. 9-12<sup>th</sup> grade. Great program. Sometimes a struggle, dedicated teachers. Building 38-ft boat. Put together from kit named the *Kraken*. Photo room, kids doing photography. Hydroponics room growing veggis inside reflective warm room (lettuce, peppers) Separate aquaponics with gold fish.

Kindergarten registration March 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> at NMU. Student board reps, 2 from H.S. one from alt high school, non-voting but part of program, planning trip to Al Qual and Empty Bowls. Raises nearly \$10k in past years. Handmade bowls each unique using learned patterns and techniques in conjunction with NMU students. TWERP March 16<sup>th</sup> at MSHS.

**High School**: PTSO working on grant from Meijer for now announcement sound system for whole school. Awarded grant request to pay lifeguard (currently not paid) for swim classes. Funded request for die-cutting machine for birthday wall, Cricket. Parent/teacher conferences Feb 27<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> 4-7pm.

**Bothwell Middle School:** Baycliff cards on sale for 7<sup>th</sup> grade Baycliff trip, \$10 each. Another Econo/boxtops competition underway. These make a lot of money, hoping we make enough to avoid having to do other fundraisers. Celebrated school counselor week in early February, brought flowers to Mrs. Addison and Mrs. Kyle. Planning movie night for the near future. Planning bookfair to coincide with parent/teacher conferences, use Sign Up Genius for volunteers. Funding a request to redecorate cafeteria \$150 now, \$150 later. Hosting staff luncheon Thursday of parent teacher conferences Feb 28th catered by Border Grill.

**Cherry Creek**: Did not meet last month due to weather. Movie night at school March 8<sup>th</sup> on wall in gym, people bring beanbags/sleeping bags. Bought a lisc to show movies, do it every month and is well attended! Showing the movie *Everyone's Hero*. Works out really well. Creating incentives for 5<sup>th</sup> graders: what do others do to sell more Chili Cookoff tickets? **Selling old popcorn machine for \$100 not broken just old**. Bookfair with parent/teacher conferences early March. Can't do SMILE AMAZON because not

night 27<sup>th</sup> at Harlow Park. Some staff working on 4-year literacy project with NMU and MSU Flint, My Literacy...what literacy means and how its presented to students.

**Sandy Knoll:** Some changes in parent association: president Igor stepped down. Tricia Bush new president...Tracy Bush VP...Amber Mota secretary. Sledding party cancelled due to weather.
